Judge Ian Pringle QC, re-
recorder of Oxford, described
Hutchinson's crimes as "des-
picable".

He ordered Hutchinson to
serve an extended licence pe-
riod of seven years on top of
his maximum jail term after
he was released from prison.

Hutchinson, of Garford,
near Abingdon, had admitted
27 charges including rape, sex-
ual assault, voyeurism, out-
raging public decency, making
indecent images of children,
theft of a nasal endoscope to
help him take his images, and
possession of ketamine.

Claire Fraser, mitigating,
said he had been receiving
therapy for his voyeuristic
urges before his arrest in De-
cember.

In a letter written to the
court he apologised to his vic-
tims for the "distress" he had
caused them, and also to fel-
low medics for bringing the
profession into disrepute.
